English Reading Course

Objectives

The goals of this English Reading Course are as follows:

- To improve the participants' academic English skills especially reading,
- To help the participants to develop reading skills needed to succeed in their studies or in their jobs,
- To provide English learning atmosphere.

Targets

The materials in the course book are relevant for academic/administrative members of non-English departments from various disciplines. It is assumed that at the beginning of the course, the participants have intermediate proficiency of English, have passed General English courses and would like to enhance their academic reading skills.

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CHAPTER ONE

THE IMPORTANCE OF ENGLISH

Study Skill

Skimming

Objectives

- Participants understand the concept of one of the reading techniques, i.e. skimming.
- Participants are able to find out what a text is about by using skimming technique.

Skimming

Skimming is a very fast-paced reading. The readers skim to obtain an overview of the form and the contents of a text, including information such as the writer's main point, the overall organization of the material, and how the text relates to the needs and interests of the readers. Skimming is necessary to decide whether or not one has to read a text more in details, or to review a text already read.

So how should an effective reader skim a text?

- Read the title, subtitles, subheadings or illustrations (if any) to find out what the text is about.
- Determine the main points which are usually stated at the beginning of a paragraph, section or chapter.
- Read as fast as possible while leaving out large chunks of material. Read only key sentences and phrases and a few of the details.
- Read the summary of the text.

Skimming is a comprehensive work. It should be done when the readers do not have much time and wish to cover materials at the fastest possible rate.

In some countries even drivers of buses or streetcars and sellers speak English well. These data show clearly that English plays an important role in international travel.
	<p>The formal teaching of languages in Indonesia begins at elementary school. Children learn the national language, Indonesian, by the time they enter the first grade of elementary school. When they reach the fourth grade, they are introduced to English language. In some schools, the children also start to</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • learn Arabic or Chinese language. At the elementary level, the language lecturers usually teach vocabulary and simple grammatical structures. It can be said that at the elementary level, Indonesian students have learnt at least two languages.
	<p>The quality of English written and spoken by Filipinos studying in private schools varies according to which schools they attend. Filipinos who attend private schools most likely speak and write grammatically correct English and can carry conversation with relatively correct diction. The very expensive</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • private schools produce students who can speak and write English almost like a native. These students often claim that they can express their feelings and ideas clearly and fluently only in the English language. It can be concluded that the choice of private schools determines the quality of one's written and spoken language.

The Importance of English in Asia

Students, who are not using English in business situations, can use the language to watch movies, listen to songs in English, and look up information on the Internet that might not be available in their mother tongue. It can be said that mastering English means mastering a very important medium for international communication.

Fluency in English brings some advantages at least in the fields of economic and communication. English can bring people wealth and will help them catch up with the rest of the world. Thus, English is obviously no longer the exclusive property of the Anglo-Saxons. It has become a language that every nation should know.
